In order to further open access research and internet publishing, a digital repository and an electronic review are available for your publications.

Thematically organized portals enable many different modes of access to a variety of subjects and fields of art history for education and research. Altogether, the gateways will evolve into a complex information system. The tutorials section offers electronic lessons in academic research methods that have been created cooperatively and are continually updated. Developed with collaboration from specialists in various fields, these categories are an especially valuable aid to research.
